Dear Petition Representatives,

The referendum petition sections filed with the Clerk's Office on Thursday, April 1, at 4:50 p.m. have been accepted and reviewed by a team from the Clerk's Office. The attached petition receipt is being provided documenting the number of petition sections, pages of signatures, and total signatures turned in.

Greeley Municipal Code requires in §2.02.200(c) that:

The referendum petition, signed by qualified electors equal in number to ten percent (10%) of the total vote cast in the last general City election, shall be filed with the City Clerk within thirty (30) days after the final passage of the ordinance to which the referendum is applicable.

April 1, 2021, marks 30 days after the final passage of Ordinance No. 10, 2021. In the last general City election, in November of 2019, a total of 21,914 ballots were cast. This means at least 2,192 signatures are required to reach the 10% threshold required for a valid petition. While the petition was filed in a timely manner, the total number of signatures submitted, prior to any review of their validity, does not meet the required threshold to constitute a valid petition. Therefore no further referendum actions will proceed.
